Directed academic curriculum development to address common concerns and promoting mutual understanding and cooperation.

Achievements:

Leadership role in times of changing security environment, it was an opportunity to optimize NDC potential through the NATO Military Committee NDC Review (2014). Academic working group was established and academic curricula advanced to the highest academic standards. The NDC Senior Course Accreditation in accordance with the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) of the Bologna Process was successfully implemented in 2016. Postgraduate studies in international security, are modelled by blended approach to studies, and facilitated by NDC in close cooperation with several Universities.

It was nevertheless fundamental to preserve the NDC core values and the mission of the Alliance's strategic level academic institution that is open to Allies and partners alike, enhancing cohesion and cooperative spirit, a common understanding of contemporary security challenges and how they are perceived, and preparing senior military officers and civilian equivalent for appointments in NATO and NATO related multinational and national duties. A number of participants increased to the Middle East Faculty optimum capacity with continuous representation from GCC and other Middle East partner countries.

The NDC Research Division became a leading think tank within the international strategic community. Continued support to NATO mission, providing policy advice, research and outreach efforts. The principle of academic freedom was fully upheld, explaining, informing and shaping strategic level policy deliberations of the Alliance on topical political and military issues, through objective, innovative, high-quality research and analysis. In addition, the Senior Course committees' research projects were successfully aligned with the Alliance's and Partner nations' security concerns, thereby substantially adding to the strategic discourse on a wide range of relevant issues. The NDC became even more prominent actor offering platform for discussion hosting and participating in conferences, seminars, roundtables globally as well as regionally.

The annual International Kyiv Week, jointly organized by the NDC, the Ukrainian National Defence University (UNDU), and NATO School Oberammergau, gathered over 400 Ukrainian military officers and diplomats, discussing global and regional security issues, and the annual Conference of Commandants, bringing together more than 50 Commandants of National Defence Colleges to discuss professional military education under the NDC's lead.
